Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Commercial held on August 17, 2017 at 6:00 P.M., at the Township Hall, 1768 Main Street, Port Norris, NJ

Mayor Sutton presided and called the meeting to order with the announcement that the meeting had been advertised, that it was being electronically recorded and being held in full compliance of the Open Public Meeting Act.

Mayor asked everyone to stand and join the committee in the Flag Salute and Lord's Prayer.

Mayor said Lt. Horsey is not present this evening, so we'll go forward with consideration of minutes and bill list.

Mayor said you have the minutes of previous meeting.

Minutes of Regular Meeting July 20, 2017

Committeeman Vizzard made motion to approve. Mayor Sutton seconded the motion with a unanimous roll call vote of the members present.

Mayor said the committee had been presented copy of Bill List of August 2017. Mayor asked for motion.

Committeeman Vizzard made motion to approve. Mayor Sutton seconded the motion with a unanimous roll call vote of the members present.

Mayor called upon Edward Dennis, Engineer, for his report.

Mr. Dennis said NJDOT State Aid Program applications have to be filed by October 6, 2017 and that he and public works supervisor will do an onsite inspection and determine what roads should be submitted to the committee for approval. He said township received NJDOT grant of \$181,000 for Raymond Drive, Phase III Reconstruction, that bids were received on June 15, 2017 and contract was awarded to Asphalt Paving Systems, Inc., preconstruction meeting scheduled for September 6<sup>th</sup> at 11:00 a.m. Mr. Dennis said the NJDEP Shore Protection Program (Bivalve Station Shore Protection Improvements) is still pending NJDEP approval. This included funding from the following: Bureau of Coastal Engineering funding \$75,000; FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program funding \$40,050 and NJ State Police funding \$38,350. Mr. Dennis said township received a grant of \$213,044 for Laurel Lake Drainage Phase III. He said preliminary engineering approved at June 15<sup>th</sup>, meeting, project scope to be reduced to meet grant allotment and they will apply for Phase IV to complete the project. Mr. Dennis said for Roadway Improvements, cost information for budgeting purposes: Lakeshore Drive, \$135,000 and Berry Avenue \$125,000.

Mayor said Clint has been discussing the situation with broken drainage pipes on Brown Street, and the amount of flooding, I recommend that we apply for a grant to do drainage and paving for Brown Street.

Mayor Sutton said we have correspondence from the Competition Dirt Riders for their annual motorcycle parade permit. The formation is at Mauricetown Fire Hall, on August 27, 2017, they have produced a Certificate of Liability Insurance and a resolution is on tonight's agenda and then everything will be sent to the county for approval.

Mayor said we have a memo from David Dean, Construction/Housing/Zoning Officer regarding abandoned property at 9543 Highland Street, Mauricetown. Mr. Dean's memo stated that violation notices were sent to Michele McBride owner of 9543 Highland Street, under International Code to clean up trash and debris from the yard, mow grass, board up all windows and remove abandoned vehicles by July 27<sup>th</sup>, 2017. No response has been received by Mr. Dean. He wants to know what is the pleasure of the committee regarding this property and the unsightly conditions of same.

Mayor Sutton said he wants to authorize the road department to clean up the debris, cut grass, board up windows and doors on lower level and to remove or relocate the abandoned vehicles and then to figure up the cost of the men and equipment used to clean up the property and file a lien against the property.

Committeeman Vizzard said he would like to hold off on the mayor's decision since our solicitor is not present this evening. He said he just wanted to be sure the procedure was the correct one.

Mayor Sutton said he had discussed the property with the solicitor and he had instructed Dave Dean to send violation notice to owner who didn't respond. He'd like this to be taken care of.

Committeeman Vizzard said as long as solicitor agreed he would approve.

Mayor said I'll make a motion for road department to be authorized to remove trash, cut grass, board up windows and doors on lower level and relocate or remove cars.

Committeeman Vizzard seconded motion and roll call vote unanimous of members present.

Mayor said we have a letter from William Reilly, Attorney for Ricci Bros., asking for an extension on their sandmining permit because of delays in their maps and plans for their renewal application coming before the land use board.

Clerk said I am suggesting four months extension until December 31, 2017 and I have prepared a resolution for your consideration on tonight's agenda.

Committee said they didn't have a problem with an extension for Ricci Bros.

Mayor Sutton said we have a memo from Rachael Cobb, member of the Port Norris Historical Society to put on an event like the City of Millville with a contest of scarecrow displays on the light poles. The society would contact businesses and organizations to participate. Cindy Tawes will help the society get organized.

Committee approved but said road supervisor feels road department should supervise the attachment of the scarecrows to the light poles.

Mayor Sutton said The Cumberland County Coastal Connection and Coordinator, Owner of Beaver Dam Boat Rentals, Lin Watermen in Dividing Creek is sponsoring "Crabs & All That Jazz" for Saturday, September 16, 6:00 am to 6:00pm from Fairton to Matts Landing and some of the events will take place on the docks in Bivalve and the CCCC wants to know if our public works could pickup the trash in Bivalve.

Committee said they didn't have a problem with that.

Mayor Sutton said we have an ordinance for second reading and public hearing. The ordinance was adopted on introduction on July 20, 2017.

## **ORDINANCE 2017-582**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF COMMERCIAL, COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND AND NEW JERSEY, PROVIDING FOR THE CONTRACTING OF SERVICES FOR THE REPAIR OF TERMITE DAMAGE IN VARIOUS SECTIONS OF THE TOWNSHIP ADMINISTRATION BUILDING AND APPROPRIATING \$15,400.00 AVAILABLE IN THE CAPITAL FUND RESERVE FOR BUILDING AND GROUNDS

A motion was made and seconded to open meeting to the public for comment. Mayor asked anyone wishing to speak to come forward, we have a new system and we need to see how it picks up.

Mr. Judson Moore stated that the township, once we knew we had termites we hired Sheppard's and they came and treated the outside of the municipal building, he questioned why are you passing an ordinance for termites.

Mayor Sutton said we did treat the termites but now we have to replace what they destroyed over past years.

Mr. Clint Miller, Public Works Supervisor, said and we have live hives still in the building and we have had to call Sheppards back in to treat those hives and we've had to tear out and replace in the assessor's office, the corridor to the court office and meeting room.

Mr. Moore said the township has spent the money before you adopted the ordinance.

Mayor Sutton said we had no idea of the extent of the damage that had been done and we don't think that it is over yet, we think there is a problem with this wall, plus the construction and clerk's office.

Mayor asked for additional comments regarding the ordinance and Mrs. Kathy Hoduka said they have rentals and the same problem with neighboring properties having high grass and the grass needs to be cut, we pay high taxes on our properties.

Mayor Sutton said he believes that Mr. Dean has already filed violations notices to the owners of the properties and it just takes time.

Committeeman Vizzard said he knows Mr. Dean has filed violation notices, he has copies.

Mr. Miller said the road department can cut back the area next to the road. when there is a visual problem with very high grass.

Mayor Sutton said regarding the taxes, the township has not increased the taxes, the school's increase was minute. He said the fire district didn't go up, the county went

up eight cents on a hundred and we put a letter in with the tax bills urging taxpayers that are not happy with their tax bills to call them, we even put their telephone number in the letter.

Mayor asked if there was anyone else wishing to speak regarding the Ordinance for termite repair and Mrs. Woods said the property next to her is an eye sore, I've lived here twenty some years and I fell like I'm living in the slums, and I don't want to live in the slums.

Mayor Sutton asked Mrs. Woods if the committee could just finalize the ordinance and they would be glad to talk to her at the public portion of the meeting.

Mrs. Woods said that would be fine.

Mayor Sutton asked again if anyone else wanted to speak and said he would make a motion to adopt the ordinance.

Committeeman Vizzard seconded the motion and a unanimous roll call vote was taken from the members present.

Mayor Sutton said we have resolutions and they will be read by title only under Consent Ordinance 2017-1.

Mayor Sutton asked for a motion to approve the resolutions.

Committeeman Vizzard said he would make the motion to adopt Resolutions 2017-, 96,97,98.

Mayor Sutton seconded the motion. Roll call vote, unanimous of the members present.

Mayor said on the reports of the officials.

Committeeman Vizzard said he had nothing at this time.

Mayor Sutton said we had a special meeting with the auditor and chief financial officer to discuss monies for Berry Avenue and Lakeshore Drive and this is something that we can do without raising taxes and hopefully it will be done before this year ends.

Mayor asked for motion to open meeting to public, Committeeman Vizzard seconded the motion.

Mrs. Alice Woods said she agrees with everything Mrs. Hoduka said, grasses need to be cut on abandoned properties and Lakeshore needs to be paved.

Mr. Hoduka said he feels that Mr. Dean has a serious problem when it comes to abandoned properties that the banks have repossessed or foreclosed on because he notifies them and nothing gets done. He said he realizes it is difficult. He said he how difficult it is to get even property owners and renters to cut the grass and keep the properties clean but he has to do it with his rentals and he needs the adjoining owners to do the same.

Mr. Edward Dennis said there is a program out there called Community Champions which is a third party organization that help municipalities with situations like this.

Mayor Sutton said it is very difficult for Mr. Dean to get anything done when it comes to banks taking ownership. He sends violation notices to the banks but basically you need a name in order to file a complaint, Last year we adopted a couple of things hoping to make things easier for him.

Mr. Hoduka said his property taxes went up \$200 on his property.

Mr. Judson Moore said last month there was talk of adopting a bond ordinance to do road work. He said he had an article from year 2000 where township received a Small Cities \$400,000 grant, a grant from NJDOT for \$140,000 and he would like to see the township continue to apply for grants rather than to bond. He said Laurel Lake was classified as 51% low to moderate income residents. Mr. Moore said township received many grants and I feel we can still obtain them, so let's not put the burden on the taxpayers, go after grants.

Mr. Dennis said he's not sure that is the correct number anymore and it could require a new survey to see just where the 51% is located.

Mayor Sutton said the township is going to continue to go after grants.

Mr. Moore said what about the conveyance center landfill, you mentioned something about changes.

Mr. Miller said he and Heather had attended a meeting at the county and there are new regulations commencing January 2018. He said no commercial businesses allowed, no vehicles with commercial tags allowed, no pickup trucks with name on side not allowed, these have to go to the county landfill. There will be a change in the municipal pass, they have to be numbered, we have to keep a record, take photo of driver license, these are part of the things discussed and when we brought up about the residents with names on their trucks bringing in their own bulk items and not being happy when turned away, the county said so what that's the way it is. If the township allows anyone one that is not supposed to use our landfill, they will take away our permit and close us down. Residents are not going to be very happy in 2018.

Mayor Sutton asked for further comments and being none asked for a motion to close the public portion and to adjourn the meeting.

Committeeman Vizzard made motion to close public portion and to adjourn the meeting.

Mayor confirmed.
