Mayor Sutton presided and called the meeting to order with the announcement that the meeting had been advertised, that it was being electronically recorded and being held in full compliance of the Open Public Meeting Act.

Mayor Sutton asked everyone to stand and join the committee in the Flag Salute and Lord's Prayer.

Mayor Sutton said Lt. Horsey is present this evening for the monthly report of the New Jersey State Police.

Lt. Horsey said during the month of August 2017, they had 124 motor vehicle stops, 3 motor vehicle accidents, 96 property checks and 1 burglary, which was a home that was unoccupied. He said he wants to remind everyone that they need to lock their garages, sheds, homes, cars etc., and to take anything of value from the yard and lock it up.

Mayor asked if anyone had questions for the Lieutenant.

Mr. Judson Moore inquired if the Bike Patrol was out there doing any patrolling.

Lt. Horsey said they have not been out there this year.

Mayor Sutton asked if anyone else had questions for the Lieutenant and with none, he thanked Lt. Horsey and said we have Mr. Clint Miller and Ms. Nicole Giacalone to discuss new convenience center regulations for 2018.

Mayor stated that we have Nicole Giacalone, Senior Environmental Health Specialist Cumberland County Health Department here this evening to explain what the new procedures are going to be next year at the convenience center.

Mr. Clint Miller, Public Works Supervisor and Ms Giacalone addressed the committee in the fact that no commercial vehicles would be allowed into the landfill, not even if people are only bringing in their own household bulk items, they would have to take everything to the Cumberland County Improvement Authority. Pickup trucks that have commercial license plates are not allowed, and they too cannot bring in their own bulk items. Trucks with business names on them are not allowed. People will have to come to the township hall with their driver's license and registration and we will take pictures of them, they will be given a tag that they will hang on their mirror when entering the convenience center, they will be given a number which will be their tag number and the two will have to match.

Many people are not going to like the new DEP and county health department rules and regulations but if the township does not abide by the rules it will be fined heavily, \$5,000 per violation. Lawrence Township just got fined for a very similar incident, pickup truck with name

bringing in own trash, it doesn't matter, he has to take his trash to the Cumberland County Improvement Authority and pay tipping fees.

Committee questioned the motives, that the residents are not going to be very happy, especially the seniors and individuals that do not have a pickup truck and rely on their neighbors, friends, etc., people that do not charge them for taking their bulk items. Some of these residents won't even be able to afford to hire someone to take their bulk items to the CCIA, plus pay tipping fees. Result, will be couches, chairs bulk items piled up in yards or thrown in the woods. This is not a good program for many of our township residents.

Committeeman Vizzard said he falls under the category, he has his name on his truck and he won't be able to take his own items to our Convenience Center.

Mr. Miller said he just wanted to remind the committee of the fine the township will get, \$5000 is a lot of money and it is \$5000 for each violation.

Mayor thanked Mr. Miller and Ms. Giacalone for their report.

Mayor said next item on the agenda is the minutes of previous meetings prepared by Clerk Hannah Nichols and the Bill List for September 2017 prepared by Pam Humphries, Chief Financial Officer.

Committeeman Vizzard made motion to approve and Committeeman Jamison seconded with unanimous roll call vote.

Mayor said committee has received a letter from Bob Watson offering \$3,000 for Block 117, Lots 9807, known as 411 Opal Road, 120X100.

Mayor said township sold this property at May 20<sup>th</sup> landsale but there was an infringement on property by building being few inches from property line, buyer backed out. He said he thinks committee should accept Mr. Watson's offer and in order to meet the state requirements, I make a motion that we have a landsale for this property at our regular November 16<sup>th</sup> meeting. Motion was seconded, vote unanimous.

Mayor said we have a letter from the Attorney Generals Office regarding a new program called "Safe Care Cam Program", this allows individuals that have dependents in institutions and nursing homes to monitor the care they are receiving. Mayor said there are flyers on the counters of each office and there's a number interested parties can call.

Mayor Sutton said we have bids on two township owned properties.

Mr. Seeley said township has received a bid of \$200 for Block 60, Lot 606, property was on the May 20<sup>th</sup> landsale list, adjoining owners notified certified, return receipt, advertised two times, September 8<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Seeley asked for additional bidders and being none asked the decision of the committee.

A motion was made and seconded to sell Block 60, Lot 606 to Sheppard Kilby with a unanimous roll call vote.

Mr. Seeley said township received a bid of \$200 for Block 60, Lot 611, on May  $20^{th}$  landsale list, adjoining owners notified certified, return receipt, advertised two times, September  $8^{th}$  and  $15^{th}$ . Mr. Seeley asked for additional bidders and being none asked the decidison of the committer.

A motion was made and seconded to sell Block 60, Lot 611 to Sheppard Kilby with a unanimous roll call vote.

Mayor said we have an introduction of Ordinance 2017-582.

#### **ORDINANCE 2017-582**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF COMMERCIAL, COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND, NEW JERSEY, AMENDING ORDINANCE 2017-581, FINALLY ADOPTED ON AUGUST 17, 2017 TO AMEND SECTION 1 TO READ "VARIOUS REPAIRS TO BUILDING AND GROUNDS" APPROPRIATING \$15,400 AVAILABLE IN THE CAPITAL FUND RESERVE FOR BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Commercial, County of Cumberland, New Jersey, as follows:

- Section 1. The funding for various repairs to buildings and grounds.
- Section 2. The amount of \$15,400 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Fund Reserve for Buildings and Grounds.
- Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon publication of notice of final adoption as provided by law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Commercial.

A motion was made and seconded to adopt ordinance on first reading with a unanimous roll call vote.

Mayor said we have Ordinance 2017-583 for introduction.

### COMMERCIAL TOWNSHIP BOND ORDINANCE 2017-583

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE FUNDING OF AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION FOR ROAD AND DRAINAGE REPAIRS IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF COMMERCIAL, IN THE COUNTY OF CUMERLAND, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$300,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$285,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF COMMERCIAL, IN THE COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Commercial, in the County of Cumberland, New Jersey (the "Township") as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a), there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$300,000, including the sum of \$15,000 as the down payment required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets. The improvement described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance shall be provided for through the issuance of bonds and/or bond anticipation notes rather than as a deferred charge in the budget of the next succeeding year.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose not covered by application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$285,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

- Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which the bonds are to be issued is to fund an emergency appropriation for road and drainage repairs on Lake Shore Drive and Berry Avenue previously provided for in Resolution #2017-100, adopted on August 23, 2017, including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond

ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The Township hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose that the Township may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 10 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local

Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$285,000, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$60,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement.

Section 7. The Township hereby declares the intent of the Township to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations.

Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purpose described in Section 3(a) hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the Township is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Township and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Township. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Township pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Township and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Township fails to comply with its undertaking, the Township shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

Mayor Sutton asked for a motion and Committeeman Vizzard made motion to adopt and Committeeman Jamison seconded with a unanimous roll call vote.

Mayor Sutton said we have several resolutions which will be read by title only.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a Stipulation of Dismissal was signed by the parties' counsel to dismiss the litigation in this matter.
